

Greeter (Volunteer)

Thursday/Sunday Services

Role

A Greeter meets each church guest with a friendly demeanor and greeting so that each guest feels welcomed, wanted, and loved. Greeting at church is an important function that contributes to the church's vision: reaching the world for Jesus, one person at a time.

Expectation

Greeters get the unique opportunity to make the first impression for new guests. Let's work together to make sure that we create a neighborly environment for our members and a first impression that encourages the new guest to return.

Each Greeter is responsible for welcoming church guests during their scheduled service. Service expectations of a Greeter include:

- Engages with guests walking into service with a friendly demeanor
- Provides a cordial greeting to and makes eye contact with each guest
- Is available and open to answer questions from guests
- Walks with new guests to their next steps, including the New Guest kiosks (does not merely point out areas)
- Offers a mint or sticker to guests (if holding a basket)
- Limits conversation with other volunteers when guests are arriving
- Is not on cellular or other devices while serving

In addition to the service expectations, volunteers are expected to participate in regular training, celebrations, and other ministry events. Volunteers are encouraged to invite new volunteers to join the team by inviting friends, family, Life Group members, etc. to serve with them. If you have a new volunteer for the team, please have them connect with the Hospitality Ministry Lead.

Personal Expectations:

- Membership
- Attend weekly worship service
- Participate weekly in a Life Group
- Maintain a consistent devotional time with God
- Live obediently to God's Word with your time, talents, and resources

Goal

Every member, regular attendee, and new guest is personally greeted and welcomed upon entering into our church building for weekend services. Every guest feels: welcomed, wanted, and loved.
